

# **Baby Doll Circle Time:**

## **Attune & Play**

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*"All learning begins in relationship."* – Dr. Becky Bailey

For optimal social-emotional and brain development, children must have regular and frequent face-to-face <u>connection</u> time with an <u>attuned</u> attachment figure.

- 1. Actively calm
- 2. Relaxation in the routine \_\_\_\_\_
- 3. Create connections \_\_\_\_\_

#### \*\*Attuned: Being Aware and Responsive\*\*

**D.N.A.** helps us teach instead of punish and increases children's willingness to learn and use new skills. Infants and toddlers need to be **noticed (describe what the child is doing)**.

Describing helps:

- The adult ATTUNE to the child
- The child become aware of body and facial expressions
- The child understand the nonverbal signals of others
  - **D** = Describe: "Your face went like this. Your arms went like this."
  - **N** = Name: "You seem sad."
  - A = Acknowledge: "You want Mommy. I will keep you safe until Mommy comes back."

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### OPPORTUNITIES TO "RELIVE" CONNECTION MOMENTS THROUGH BABY DOLL CIRCLE TIME

Maximize loving interactions and attuned moments with children. They experience similar neural firings when "giving" the touch, eye contact, and playfulness to baby dolls that they have received from you. They are literally "reliving" the connection moments they have had with you as they play with the doll.

\*\*JOINT ATTENTION: (Infant – Caregiver – Object Interactions) CRITICAL for Healthy Development\*\*

JOINT

attention

- $\rightarrow$  Attention:
  - $\rightarrow$  paying attention to the same thing
- $\rightarrow$  Emotions:
  - $\rightarrow$  share an emotional state
- $\rightarrow$  Intentions:
  - $\rightarrow$  2 or more people try to accomplish the same thing and they know they are doing it together

Joint attention is the process of sharing one's experience of observing an object or event by following gaze or pointing gestures. Joint attention is a fundamental goal during the first year of life and critical for the development of the following:

- Theory of mind: Other people have different perceptions.
- Social referencing: Looking to attachment figure in ambiguous situations to make sense and get information, and learn to read the faces of others.
- Language development
- · Impulse control/executive attention skills
- Predictive of emotional regulation at 24 months.

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
